- 1920 - "Camera Club to Meet at Y.M.C.A. Tonight." *Telegraph-Herald*. Friday, May 14, 1920.
- 1920 - "Hornzee and Russell Win Camera Prizes." *Telegraph-Herald*. October 3, 1920. [Mentions the darkroom of the Dubuque 'Y' Camera Club. Winners: Reginald Hornzee, William Russell, Earl Falk. The prize was an enlarger from G.E. Tasker.]
- 1920 - "Prize to be given for best photo made." *Telegraph-Herald*, March 7, 1920. [A contest for members of the boy' camera club at the YMCA.]
- 1921 - "Camera Club to Hike to Swiss Valley Wilds." *Dubuque Telegraph-Herald*, May 8, 1921, p. 8. [The Y club hike was led by H.C. Gibson, "secretary of the boys department and an expert in the art of photography."]
- 1921 - "Camera Club Hears Talk on Chemistry." *Telegraph-Herald*, June 9, 1921.
- 1921 - "'Y' Camera Club Holds Successful Meeting." *Telegraph-Herald*, Oct. 20, 1921. [G.E. Tasker talked about composition and enlargement. Donald Blare elected secretary/treasurer after Reginald Hornzee moved to MN.]
- 1922 - "1921 Record Year of Service at 'Y'." *Telegraph-Herald*, January 9, 1922. [YMCA activity summary from the prior year.] "The camera club was organized, members of which are taught all the different methods of developing, printing, and picture taking. Director [H.C.] Gibson is in charge."
- 1924 - "Pioneer Clubs Planned Here." *Telegraph-Herald*. November 4, 1924. [The YMCA plans clubs around the city that are affiliated with their boys department. Officers: Earnest Puls, Edgar Champion, Alvin Baal, William Russell.]
- 1942 - "Call Meeting to Form New Camera Club." *Telegraph-Herald*. January 11, 1942, p. 15. [Carl Melander, the new general secretary of the Y, calls all adults to a new camera club, with an election of officers planned for Jan. 19, 1942.]
- 1942 - "Camera Club to Meet Again on Wednesday." *Telegraph-Herald*. January 23, 1942. [Mentions: Anthony Hughes, King Herr, Dr. Carl Hall, Dr. W.B. Zuker, C.I. Melander, Leo Link].

- 1942 - "Camera Club Hears Talk on Color Films." *Telegraph-Herald*. March 12, 1942. [Presentation on color film in movies by Eldon Imhof, followed by a display of still photos by club members. Mentioned: Harry Stearns, Eldon Clemens, Noah Taylor, H.E. Curtis, K.H. Galloway, L.L. Perry.]
- 1942 - "Camera Club to Take Chest Agency Photos." *Telegraph-Herald*. May 14, 1942. [Club to take pictures of the activities of numerous local nonprofit organizations with an exhibit scheduled for June 10.]
- 1943 - "Camera Club to Make Pictures at Meeting." *Telegraph-Herald*. Feb. 22, 1943. [John Florey, program committee chairman, arranged for models and props. Followup in Feb. 23, 1943 issue.].
- 1943 - "Camera Club in Foto Fun." *Telegraph-Herald*. Feb. 25, 1943. [News article shows a photo of Helen Weirich posed as 'Air Warden on Alert' that was made during a meeting. Many club members and models mentioned by name.]
- 1952 - "Adult Camera Fans Will Form Club to Aid Boy Photographers." *Telegraph-Herald*. October 12, 1952, p. 28. [Adults are asked to join a club that will support 60 boys in two camera clubs at the Boys Club.]
- 1953 - "Historic, Artistic Slides Shown To Camera Club." *Telegraph Herald*, January 15, 1953, p. 12. [Slide presentation by Dorothy Bechtel, art director of the public schools. PSA slide winners: Bert Vogel, Ray Grost].
- 1953 - "Women 'Invade' YMCA — but the Men Like It." *Telegraph Herald*, February 8, 1953, p. 12. [Overview of women's roles in many YMCA activities.] "The YMCA Camera and Stamp Clubs for adults, which meet twice each month in the 'Y' building, include active women members."
- 1957 – Willams, Vera. "He's Nature's Publicity Man." Profile of Dubuque photographer Willard H. Farr. *Telegraph Herald*, September 1, 1957, p. 7.
- 1971 - "Camera Club Meeting." *Telegraph Herald*, October 11, 1971, p. 5. [Brief notice of a club meeting at Interstate Power Co.]. "The program will be 'What is Photo-Journalism?' prepared by the photo-journalist division of the Photographic Society of America.
- 1972 - "Camera Club to Meet." *Telegraph Herald*, January 12, 1972, p. 25. [Brief notice of the first club meeting of the year, held at Interstate Power Co., 1000 Main St. Color slide presentations.]
