The **Dubuque Camera Club** can trace its history all the way back to the pioneering days of photography. The club was mentioned in an early photography magazine: *The Photographic Times and American Photographer* (vol. XIX, 1899, p. 360).

The club was active in the 1920s and 30s as a YMCA program. In 1942, the club was chartered as the Dubuque YMCA Camera Club (*Telegraph Herald*, Jan. 11, 1942). The club became affiliated with the N4C about three decades ago.

Today, more than 30 tri-state photographers are active in the **Dubuque Camera Club**. Skill levels range from advanced beginner to experienced pro shooter.

Most club members use digital cameras and image editing software such as Lightroom and Photoshop. Technology and post-processing is every bit as important as making that click!

We enjoy many different photographic genres, such as landscape, portrait, architectural, concert, macro, bird and wildlife, or drone photography. Whatever your favorite subject and style, you may find someone who shares your interest in the **Dubuque Camera Club**!
